Kurzbeschreibung des Formats

Die Prüflinge hören ein Gespräch zwischen einem Park-Ranger und den beiden Touristen Sarah und Ben. Während des Zuhörens beantworten sie Fragen zum Gehörten, indem sie kurze Antworten notieren.

Begründung des Leistungsniveaus

Grundlage sind die Kompetenzerwartungen zum Bereich Hör- und Hörsehverstehen aus dem LehrplanPlus für die 10. Jahrgangsstufe.

Das erhöhte Leistungsniveau bei dieser Aufgabe ergibt sich u. a. aus

- der Sprechgeschwindigkeit,
- den meist umfangreichen Redeanteilen, die in schneller Abfolge ausgetauscht werden,
- dem teils komplexen Satzbau mit schwierigen Strukturen.

Transcript

Park Ranger	Hi folks, how can I help you?
Sarah	Hi, my boyfriend and I were wondering about exploring Denali National Park by bicycle, is that possible?
Park Ranger	Oh, are you from Britain?
Sarah	Well, I'm British and he's American.
Park Ranger	Well, of course, it's possible to cycle, but I don't suppose you have brought your own bikes with you, have you?
Ben Marc	No, we haven't. But we saw some bike-rental places just outside the National Park entrance.
Park Ranger	Cycling is certainly a great way to explore Denali National Park. You can ride the whole length of the Denali Park road. But it's over 90 miles to the end. Were you



	thinking of staying overnight in the park?
Sarah	We only wanted to spend the day. Can you suggest some options for us?
Park Ranger	Well, you can start from the park entrance and turn around at some point, but I'd suggest you take the free shuttle bus into the park and get off at Savage River.
Ben	Why is that?
Ranger	The first 15 miles of the park road are darn steep and are used by cars as well. Our shuttle bus will take your bicycles further into the park, to bypass the worst of the traffic.
Ben	We actually wanted to have a good view of the summit of Denali. Is that possible from there?
Park Ranger	You get amazing views all the way from Savage River to Igloo Creek campground. That takes around two to three hours by bike. Once you are there, you can take the shuttle bus or cycle back to the park entrance. It's all downhill.
Sarah	Great! Sounds good. Are there any restaurants along the road?
Park Ranger	No, I'm afraid not, you'd have to pack your own provisions. But there are a lot of restaurants north and south of the park entrance which sell pre-packaged food for you to take into the park.
Ben	What about water?
Park Ranger	There are several water filling stations along the way, in accordance with our sustainability policy. We're trying to eliminate the use of throw-away plastic bottles inside the National Park. And please use the recycling points.
Sarah	Yes, of course. Do we need to look out for bears? I've heard that there are a lot of them inside the park.
Park Ranger	Both black and grizzly bears live in the park. The usual safety advice concerning bears is summarized in this leaflet. Please take a copy with you and follow the advice.
Ben	Thank you.
Park Ranger	And the bicycles you can rent are also equipped with a bear spray. You can watch a short video on how to use it on that display right behind you. But you should stay clear not only of bears but of other wildlife as well, if you encounter any.
Sarah	Thank you very much for your help. That has certainly given us a lot to think about.
Park Ranger	No problem. That's what we're here for. Have a great trip. And ...
