Omar von Müller, his owner and trainer, knew that his dog was special right from the beginning. Before he became a film star you could see the dog in casting shows and in TV commercials. He has been acting for nine years.

What will Uggie's next job be? Well, his career is over now because he is too old. His vet told his family that it's time for him to relax and enjoy a quiet life at home in Hollywood.

It's not easy being a dog star, of course. Filming means that you sometimes work in the studio from morning till late at night. The animals have to learn "to act", often in noisy places, in front of many people and under hot camera lights.

Has your dog got any special talent? Can it do tricks? Then try and teach it! You never know, it could become the next superstar.
